To Obtain Clear and Well Defined Pictures:


- 1. Always load camera in subdued light.
- 2. Be sure the camera back is COMPLETELY CLOSED after loading.
- 3. Set light adjustor to correspond with light condition.
- 4. Hold camera at least 3 feet from subject.
- 5. Shield camera front from direct sun and reflections.
- 6. When subject is in motion it should be moving directly toward or directly away from camera to obtain best results.
- 7. Hold the camera steady and release shutter trigger, with SMOOTH and DELIBERATE action.
- 8. Try to take pictures on sunny days, (9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. for color).
- 9. Mail film immediately after taking pictures.
- 10. Clean lens opening and camera interior regularly with small brush.


To properly space and utilize all film:

- 1. Acquire the habit of advancing film and locking plunger after each exposure.
- 2. Never obstruct lens while taking pictures.
- 3. Avoid accidental release of shutter-trigger.

LOADING CAMERA


Locking and Unlocking Film Advance Plunger

Plunger in Open Position





To release plunger, hold camera with the trade name Micro 16 on top and press on plunger.

Plunger Locked



To lock plunger simply turn camera on its back (trade name Micro 16 down) and push plunger all the way into the case.





2 Push plunger in until dial mover touches dial



3 Pull out film pressure plate by tab and release plunger. Film pressure plate is now in open or loading position.



A Remove loaded cartridge from container and insert the film leader into the empty cartridge approximately one-half inch. Save the film cartridge box. You will need it to return your exposed film for processing.




New, Unexposed Film End is Rounded



Used or Exposed Film End is Square

- 5 Now drop both cartridges in the cartridge wells (loaded cartridge to the right) with the film strip behind the pressure plate.
- 6 Set magazine locating bars in line. Tap cartidges with finger to insure that film is seated.



- 7 Push plunger enough to release film pressure plate.
- 8 Let the plunger all the way out. The full return of the plunger to its extended position assures that film is down to proper seating.



by rotating in direction shown so that Number 22 (see arrow indicator) is in line with the peep hole. Close

so that trade name is down and push plunger in to lock. The numeral 1 now appears in the peep hole

UNLOADING THE CAMERA

When you have completed your cartridge; pump the era over and film cartridge will fall into your hand.

Do not push film trailer into magazine.

Remember you have paid for processing and printing of your pictures. Film must be returned in original cartridge and box.

HOW TO TAKE PICTURES

• LIGHT ADJUSTOR

Black and White Film:

Turn light adjustor arrow to BRIGHT for a sunny day. Turn light adjustor arrow to DULL for a cloudy day. Turn light adjustor arrow to COLOR for a very dark day. (Best pictures are obtained on a sunny day.)

Color Film:

Turn light adjustor arrow to COLOR. (Sunny days are necessary for color photography. True colors can be obtained only from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.)

When taking pictures the operator and subject should be positioned so that sun DOES NOT shine on front of camera.

SNAPPING THE PICTURE

Your picture will be as you see it in the viewer. It is most important that the Micro 16 be held steady and that the release of the shutter, trigger be SMOOTH and DELIBERATE.

· ADVANCING FILM

Release film advance plunger and push once for each new picture to be taken. Become accustomed to advancing the film and locking the plunger after each exposure. Butkus, 65
