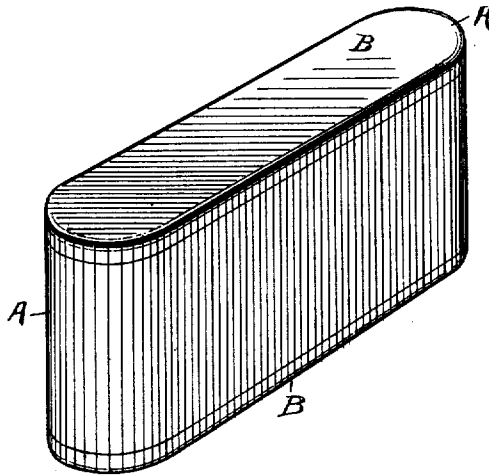

DESIGN FOR A PHOTOGRAPHIC-CAMERA BODY.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 29,376, dated September 20, 1898.

Application filed August 10, 1898. Serial No. 688,309. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANK A. BROWNELL, a citizen of the United States, residing at Rochester, in the county of Monroe and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and useful Design for Photographic-Camera Bodies, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof.

My invention relates to a design for a photographic-camera body; and it consists in the shape or configuration hereinafter described, and shown in the accompanying drawing, which latter is a perspective view of a camera embodying my design.

The camera-body, as shown, presents the general appearance of an oblong flattened

body having the ends A rounded in the direction of the shortest dimension, the upper and lower faces (indicated by B) being curved at the ends to correspond with the curved portion A.

The general outline of the camera-body is substantially rectangular when viewed from the front or rear and oblong, with round ends, when viewed from the faces B.

I claim—

The design for a photographic-camera body, substantially as herein shown and described.
