

DESIGN FOR A CAMERA

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Walter D. Teague, a citizen of the United States of America, residing at New York city, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Camera, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing forming a part thereof in which—

Fig. 1 is a perspective view of a camera constructed in accordance with my new design, the camera being in an open or picture-taking position.

Fig. 2 is a front elevation of the camera shown in Fig. 1 but with the camera in a closed or folded position.

Fig. 3 is a side elevation of the camera in a folded position, and

Fig. 4 is an end elevation of the camera shown in the preceding figures in a folded position.
