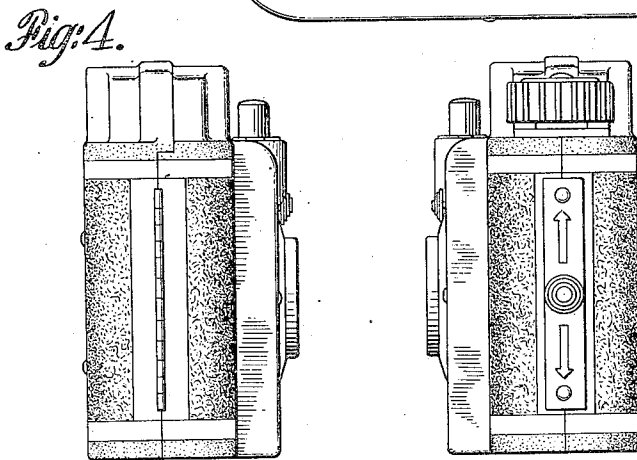
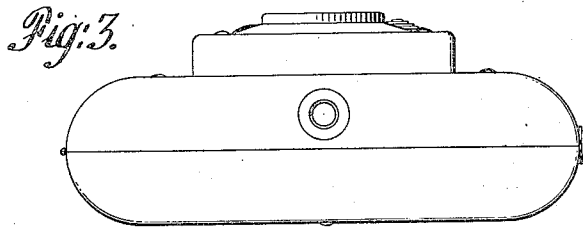
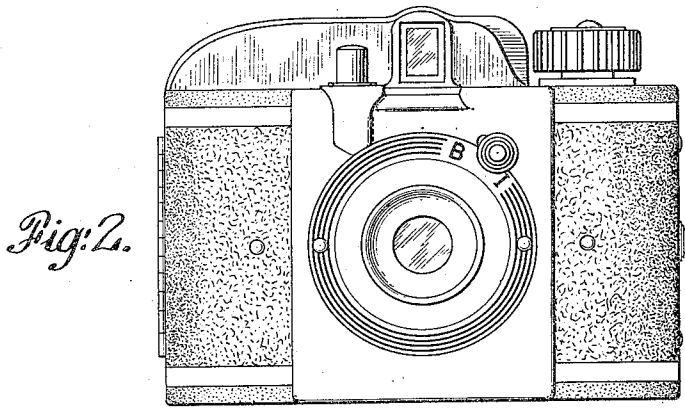
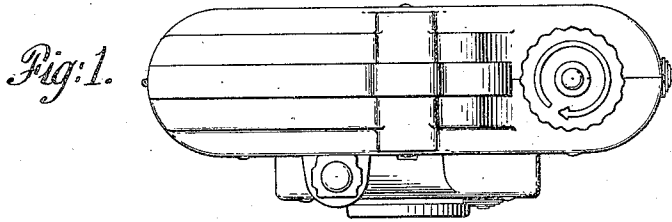

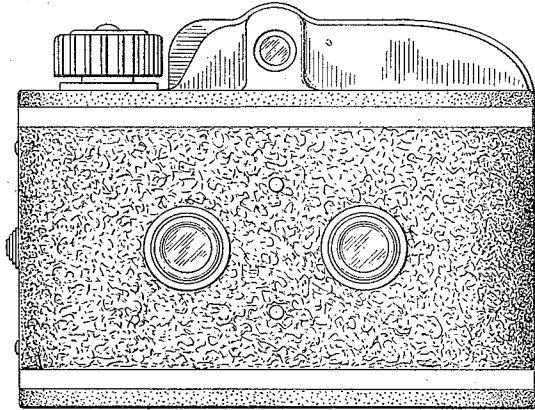

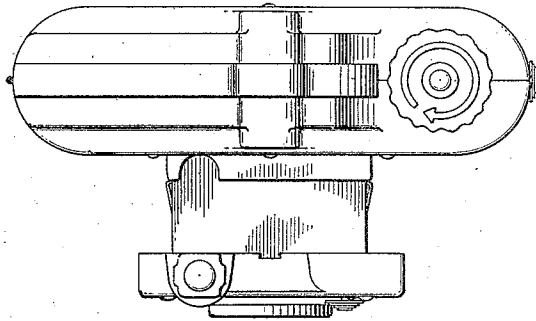
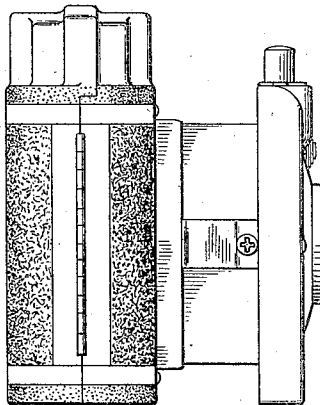

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, William L. Lawson, a citizen of the United States and a resident of Forest Hills, county of Queens, and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Camera, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof, in which:

Fig. 1 is a top plan view of a camera in closed position embodying my new design.

Fig. 2 is a front elevational view of the camera.

Fig. 3 is a bottom plan view thereof.

Figs. 4 and 5 are side elevational views of the left and right sides of the camera as seen in Fig. 2.

Fig. 6 is an elevational view of the back of the camera.

Fig. 7 is a top plan view of the camera in extended or open position.

Fig. 8 is a side elevational view of the camera in extended or open position.
